Dr. Salazar-Carrillo's tenure in the Department of Economics for the last four decades has contributed towards advancing the reputation of both the department and the university.

Dr. Salazar-Carrillo served as the Chair of the Department of Economics for approximately one decade and was instrumental in the creation of the economics Masters and Doctoral degree programs for the university. He founded the Center of Economic Research and Education and produced countless publications as a prolific researcher over the years.
